The Alien Acts lowered naturalization rate, any or all rights for foreigners in the country, and ability to do anything to the foreigners that visit the country. The sedition act was much more for John Adams' own use.

The Alien and Sedition Acts of 1798 gave the U.S. government new powers where foreigners and immigrants were concerned. The acts made it more difficult for immigrants to gain citizenship and therefore to vote, while providing new governmental authority for deporting foreigners who were considered "dangerous to the peace and safety of the United States."
